ChaMPs project short listed at North West Public Health Awards 2012

The ChaMPs alcohol programme has worked with Primary Care Trusts (PCTs) to develop the provision of Identification and Brief Advice for Alcohol. A Training Needs analysis was conducted in 2009 by Alcohol Concern and from its baseline assessment the IBA training delivered by PCTs increased by 118% from 2008/09 to 2010/11. Building on this success ChaMPs commissioned training for non-NHS partners, which was delivered in 2011/12.
